Over 2 million people work in the construction industry in the UK with many working in manual crafts or trades. Here are just some skills and qualities the industry is looking for in its new starts.

#### Willingness to learn

There is so much to learn when you're working towards a trade. Even when you're fully qualified, you'll be expected to keep up with new techniques and always be looking to improve.

#### **Good hand skills**

You'll be working with your hands throughout your working day.

Many people come to college having enjoyed technical subjects at school, but if you don't have good hand skills when you come to college, we'll teach you them.

#### **High standards**

Each project you work on will require your very best efforts. If you do a good job for someone, they'll tell one person. Do a bad job and they'll tell 10.

It's important to keep your work at a high standard.

#### Reliable

Being able to show up to work on time is an important attribute, especially when you're working a busy diary.

If you'd like to learn a trade, then our courses are a great place to start. If you're unsure which trade is right for you, then get in touch to discuss your options.

Some of our courses require no formal qualifications, while others require three National 4s or relevant Standard Grades at general level. 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# 60 anywhere...

There's a clear progression route from SCQF Level 4 courses to Advanced Craft (PDA) in each trade for students who have completed their apprenticeship.

In addition, you could look to learn new skills to become a Construction Manager or go into a technician role through further study at HNC level leading to a degree programme.

Please check with each University for their articulation requirements prior to your UCAS application. Entry is subject to availability of places and meeting entry requirements, other options may also be available.
