

Progression can lead to an advanced level of motor vehicle course and onto Higher Education on an HNC in Automotive Engineering.

Once in employment you can then undertake specialist courses designed by vehicle manufacturers such as those designed to meet the needs of the fast-paced change that's happening within the automotive industry towards electric, hybrid and autonomous vehicles.

The automotive industry is one of the largest in Scotland and technicians are in high demand. There's a wide range of jobs available within the sector in dealerships, independent garages and fleet garages.

Please check with each university for their articulation requirements prior to your UCAS application. Entry is subject to availability of places and meeting entry requirements, other options may also be available.


